Belonging in Our Diverse Community/Living Truth and Reconciliation We celebrate and respect all cultures and ethnicities in our schools.

Goal: Promote cultural sensitivity and respect for Indigenous traditions, languages, and practices within the school community.

Objective:

By the end of the academic year, achieve a 25% increase in student and parent participation in cultural awareness activities, with the aim of fostering greater understanding and appreciation of Indigenous traditions and the diverse cultures represented within the school community.

Measurable Outcomes:

- Successfully host one major multicultural event with representation from a minimum of five different cultural backgrounds, including significant participation from Indigenous communities.
- Secure participation from at least three community leaders or parents from different cultural backgrounds to share their traditions and experiences with students.

Key Performance Indicators:

- The number and diversity of cultural representations at the multicultural event.
- Attendance for the multicultural event
- Feedback from students, parents, and teachers via surveys to assess the impact on cultural sensitivity and respect within the school community.

Strengthening Our Catholic Faith

We foster a Catholic worldview of reflection, service and sacramentality.

Goal:

Enhance the integration of faith-based values and practices in the school community.

Objectives to Support the Goal:

- 1. Formation of Student Leadership Team:
- A dedicated student leadership team is recruited and operational.

Develop a spiritually meaningful morning routine, and successfully execute the new announcements by February.

- 2. Organize and participate in service and outreach projects that reflect the school's faith values. Organize an outreach project each semester that are aligned with the school's Catholic values, and reflect the theme of the Faith Plan.
- 4. Decorate the school with symbols and artwork that reflect the school's faith traditions
- 5. Plan and execute religious celebrations and holy days with the students
- 6. Increase opportunities for staff and students to engage in Music ministry

Learning Through Quality Teaching

All students demonstrate growth in literacy and numeracy. Schools reflect collaborative teaching and learning environments.

Goal:

Improve student performance in identified areas of weakness, in literacy and numeracy within one academic year.

Objectives to Support the Goal:

1. Data Analysis and Tracking:

Establish a baseline of student performance by analyzing the previous year's and fall assessment data. Identify specific weaknesses in student performance for literacy and numeracy.

2. Instructional Strategy Adjustment:

Implement adjusted instructional strategies based on data analysis and review their effectiveness.

3. Intervention Programs:

Launch targeted intervention programs for identified students, with ongoing progress monitoring.

4. Diversified Instructional Support:

Integrate a blend of the whole class, small group, and individual instruction tailored to student needs. Documentation of instructional formats and associated student performance improvements.

5. Grouping for Targeted Instruction:

Group students for targeted numeracy and literacy instruction, adjusting groups as needed based on ongoing assessments.

7. Collaboration Among Teachers:

Establish a weekly collaboration meeting for teachers to share best practices. Keep meeting minutes and a list of implemented strategies, with a review of their impact on student performance.

Success Indicators:

- Achievement of at least a 15% improvement in standardized assessment scores in identified areas of weakness.
- Positive feedback from teachers and students regarding the new instructional strategies and support programs.
- Evidence of increased collaboration and sharing of effective practices among teachers.




