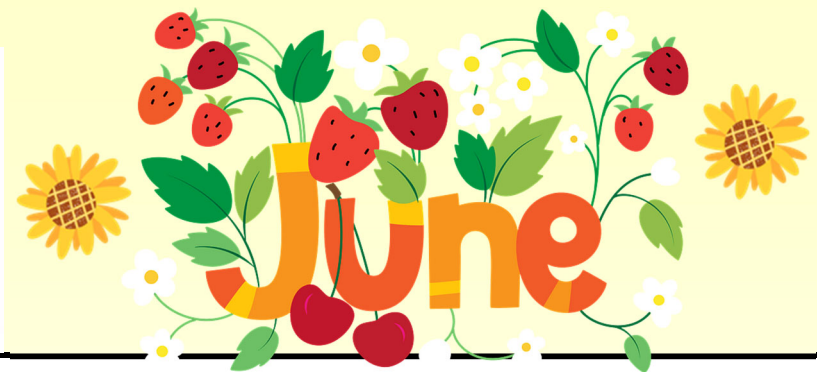
PRAYER

Gospel Reading: John 6:51-58

“Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him.” — John 14:3

What happens when you dissolve a powdered drink mix in water and shake it up? Would it be possible to separate the granules from the water once they are completely dissolved? Of course not! Our Gospel passage today reminds us that when we receive Jesus' Body and Blood in Holy Communion, he becomes a part of us, and we are changed to become more like him. Last week, we learned that God's love for us is so great that Christ was willing to die so we might be brought into the family of God. This week, we see that not only do we become a part of God's family through Jesus' death and resurrection, but Jesus went even a step further by providing a way for us to have his Body and Blood poured into us. He wants so much to be a part of us that he gives us himself in this new way. We are blessed to have an opportunity to receive him in Holy Communion.

Prayer:

*Thank you, Jesus, for offering us your Body and Blood so that your life can become our life.
Help us to prepare well to receive you in Holy Communion so we will welcome you with a clean heart.*

Reflection:

What will you say to Jesus after receiving him in Holy Communion today?
(For those who have not yet received their First Holy Communion, you can still talk to him in prayer during the communion procession.)



Gospel Reading: Matthew 9:36-10:8

“When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were...like sheep without a shepherd.” — Matthew 9:36

Shepherds have a lot of responsibility. Their flock can be as large as 1,000 sheep and all these animals need grassy pastures and good water sources so they can have enough to eat and drink. Once they have eaten much of the grass in an area, the shepherd needs to move these large groups of animals to new areas, all while keeping them protected from animals that might kill them. The shepherd also needs to care for his sheep when they are sick. It wouldn't be long before the sheep would die if their shepherd left them unattended.

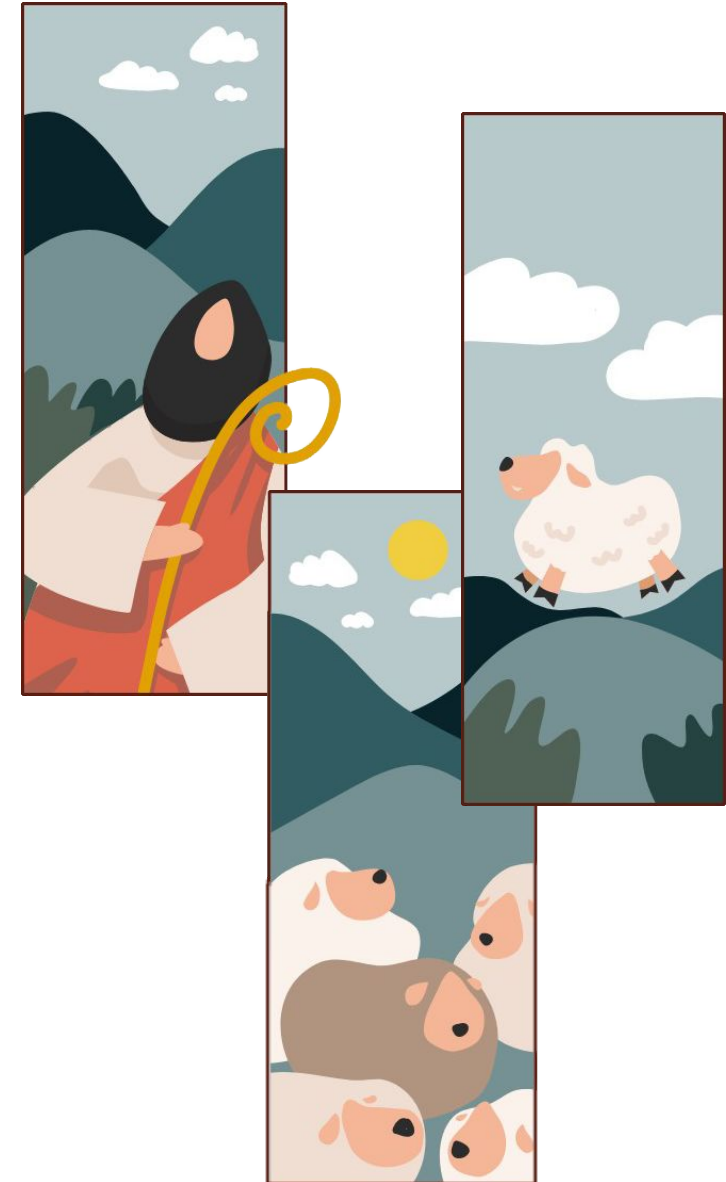
Our Gospel today shows us that Jesus is like a good shepherd who treats us like his precious sheep. He cares so much for us that he even empowers helpers to keep us spiritually healthy and safe from harm.

Prayer:

Lord, help me to turn to you when I am in trouble because you will never abandon me.

Reflection:

In what ways do you care for others like a good shepherd cares for his sheep?



Gospel Reading: Matthew 10:26-33

“What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops.” — Matthew 10:27

Have you ever had a dream that seemed so real that when you awoke you thought the events had actually happened? Many times in the Bible we read that God spoke to people in dreams. God can also speak to us in other ways besides dreams. The Gospel today says that God may sometimes speak to us quietly. If we suddenly have a sense that we should or shouldn't do something, God may be prompting us to do the right thing. Or, if we are reading a story and all-of-a-sudden it reminds us of someone who needs our help, God may be asking us to share God's love with that person. The key to hearing God is to listen carefully. We cannot tell others what God has told us if we didn't hear him, can we?

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, open my eyes so I may see clearly; open my ears so I may hear you and help others to know you.

Reflection:

After Mass today, take a few moments together to sit silently and listen. What do you hear? Is it hard not to talk, just to sit quietly? It may take some practice, but it's worth the effort if it helps us to hear God's voice.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 10:37-42

“Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.” — Matthew 10:39

In the Gospel today, Jesus says something very confusing. He says that if you lose your life, you’ll find it, and if you find your life, you’ll lose it. How can that be? Maybe it would be easier to think of it this way. Suppose for your birthday someone gave you a two-pound box of chocolate candy and you sat down in front of the TV and ate every bit of it. At first it might seem great to have as much candy as you want. But by the time you finished the entire box, how do you think you would feel? Pretty sick, no doubt. Now instead, suppose you invited five of your friends over and shared that candy with them. Instead of having a stomachache, you would have a nice memory of the time spent with your friends. See, if your life is only about you, it can be very sad, but if you follow Jesus’ example and share your life with others, you will find that life is much happier.

Prayer:

Jesus, sometimes I think only about myself. Help me to see the ways to use my life to help others. I want to live for you, Lord.

Reflection:

What is one behavior you would like to change so you can be more like Jesus?

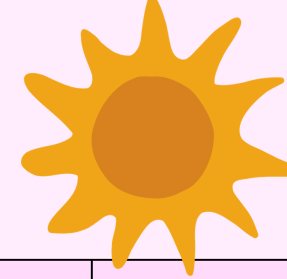

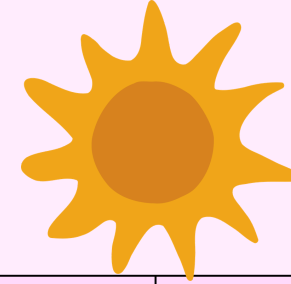
